## Virtual Orientation and Mobility (O&M) Reflection and Resources

**Reflection**: Virtual O&M experiences shared by Angie, a parent representative on the BVI Advisory Committee regarding her daughter Ruby.



O&M was definitely challenging during virtual instruction. Ruby had just started transitioning from a pre-cane to her white cane a month prior to lockdown, so I was not yet working with her on it at home. The first week, Ruby's O&M sent a few videos from <u>Parent</u> <u>Mobility</u> so I could learn some of the basic cane techniques that Ruby was working on. She then sent us an email every Wednesday with goals/instruction for the week. Throughout distance learning, I sent her videos of Ruby traveling so she could share personalized feedback with us.

We weren't going out into the community much in early spring, so we were doing the majority of Ruby's cane travel in our yard/driveway/neighborhood. One thing that worked really well was to create functional routes outside our home that Ruby could learn to travel independently. For example, Ruby learned how to get the mail (she had LOTS of Braille sent to her during distance learning!) and walk over to our neighbor's yard. We also worked on identifying the parts of her cane and opening it and folding it back up. Ruby's TBVI has also been working on Braille instruction that incorporates her cane. For example, last week during virtual learning, Ruby followed a braille recipe for "White Cane Treats" made from pretzel rods, almond bark and mini marshmallows - so cute!
